International Mustang Horse Association (IMHA) Rules for Sanctioned Event Hosts

1. Introduction

Hosting an **IMHA-sanctioned event** is a privilege that comes with the responsibility of ensuring fairness, horse welfare, and adherence to IMHA rules and regulations. All hosts must comply with the following **event hosting requirements** to maintain sanctioning status. Failure to comply may result in penalties, loss of sanctioning, or suspension from future IMHA events.

2. General Requirements for Hosts

- Hosts must submit a Sanctioning Application at least 30 days prior to the event date.
- Events must be open to all IMHA-registered mustangs in applicable divisions.
- The event must follow IMHA-approved judging criteria and competition formats.
- The host is responsible for providing a safe, organized, and professionally managed event.
- All required fees (sanctioning, judge, and participant fees) must be paid in full before the event.

3. Facility & Safety Requirements

- The event facility must provide **adequate space**, **footing**, **and shelter** for competing mustangs.
- A veterinarian must be on-site or on call for emergency situations.
- The event must have **sufficient water**, **shade**, **and rest areas** for horses and participants.
- First-aid stations must be available for both horses and riders.
- Emergency evacuation plans must be in place in case of extreme weather or other hazards.

4. Competition & Judging Standards

• IMHA-carded judges must officiate all sanctioned competitions.

- Judges must follow IMHA-approved scoring and ranking procedures.
- Minimum Class Entries: Each competition class must have at least three (3) entries to qualify for IMHA points.
- Drug-Free Competition: All competing horses must adhere to IMHA's anti-doping policies.
- The event host must ensure all competitors follow IMHA conduct and horse welfare policies.

5. Insurance & Liability

- Hosts must provide **proof of liability insurance**, listing **IMHA as an additional insured entity**.
- Participants must sign liability waivers before competing.
- IMHA is **not responsible for accidents, injuries, or property damage** at sanctioned events.

6. Event Reporting & Results Submission

- The host must submit official results within 14 days after the event.
- Trail Ride and Clinic coordinators must certify mileage and attendance using the IMHA Tracking Sheet.
- All disqualifications, rule violations, or protests must be reported **immediately** to IMHA officials.
- Failure to submit results on time may result in loss of future sanctioning privileges.

7. Code of Conduct for Hosts

- Event hosts must demonstrate **professionalism and fairness** in all aspects of event management.
- **Discrimination, misconduct, or unethical behavior** will not be tolerated and may result in loss of sanctioning.
- All event staff, volunteers, and participants must be treated with respect and courtesy.
- Hosts must ensure that all event staff understand and enforce IMHA rules and policies.

8. Violations & Penalties

- IMHA reserves the right to audit and review sanctioned events for compliance.
- Minor infractions (e.g., late result submissions, minor safety concerns) may result in warnings or fines.
- **Major infractions** (e.g., failure to provide proper horse welfare, insurance violations, or unethical conduct) may result in **event cancellation**, **loss of sanctioning**, **and host suspension**.

9. Hosting Benefits

By following these rules, event hosts will:

- Gain recognition as an IMHA-approved event organizer.
- Provide competitors with opportunities to earn IMHA points and awards.
- Have access to IMHA support, marketing, and resources for event promotion.
